



## **AFCC's 50th Anniversary Conference offers continuing education opportunities as follows:**

**Psychologists:** AFCC is approved by the American Psychological Association to sponsor continuing education for psychologists. AFCC maintains responsibility for this program and its content. The program is eligible for up to 19.5 hours of continuing education. All pre-conference institutes and plenary sessions are eligible, as are all workshops except for numbers 17, 25, 43, and 70.

**Lawyers:** The program has been approved by the California Board of Legal Specialization of the California State Bar of California for legal specialist educational credit in Family Law. It has also been approved for general MCLE credit. California attorneys must self-report hours at their re-certification.

- **MCLE:** The Institutes provide up to 6 hours and the conference provides up to 14.5 hours of MCLE credits. Attorneys must sign in at all sessions on the separate sign in sheets provided.
- **CFLS:** The Institutes provide up to 6 hours and the conference provides up to 14.5 hours in the following topics toward the educational requirements for CFLS certification: dissolution of marriage; mediation; custody of children; psychological and counseling aspects of dissolution of marriage; problems of domestic violence. Attorneys must sign in at all sessions on the separate sign in sheets provided.
- This program has been accredited by the Law Society of Upper Canada for up to 10.5 Professionalism Hours. Qualifying sessions are 1.5 hours each for workshops 12, 17, 26, 37, 56, 58, 64, 79, 80, 81 and 89.

### **Mental Health Professionals:**

- Continuing education approval from the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) is pending for up to 20.5 CE credits. NASW has endorsement of 46 state licensure boards; however, individuals will need to verify approval with their credentialing or licensing boards.
- AFCC is approved by the California Board of Behavioral Sciences to offer continuing education for MFT, LEP, LPCC and LCSW professionals in California, PCE#4630. The pre-conference institutes provide 6 hours and the conference program provides up to 13.5 hours toward continuing education required by BBS.
- AFCC is an NBCC-Approved Continuing Education Provider (ACEP™) and may offer NBCC-approved clock hours for events that meet NBCC requirements. The ACEP is solely responsible for all aspects of the program. Up to 20.5 hours may be earned.

### **Mediators:**

- All conference sessions are eligible for continuing education units through the Association for Conflict Resolution (ACR).

### **California Custody Evaluators and Mediators:**

**Domestic violence training for mediators and evaluators:** The course outline or agenda for this training has been approved as corresponding to subject areas specified in California Rules of Court, rule 5.230. The views expressed in this training are those of the trainer and do not necessarily represent the official positions or policies of the Judicial Council of California or the Administrative Office of the Courts. Pre-conference Institute 4 provides 4 hours annual DV update training. Institutes 1 and 3, and workshops 4, 5, 9, 20, 29, 31, 54, 75, 84 and 90 provide up to 8 hours instruction toward advanced DV training.

#### **Continuing education for evaluators and mediators:**

The course outline or agenda for this training has been approved as corresponding to subject areas specified in California Rules of Court, rules 5.210, 5.225, and 5.518. The views expressed in this training are those of the trainer and do not necessarily represent the official positions or policies of the Judicial Council of California or the Administrative Office of the Courts. The pre-conference Institutes provide up to 6 hours continuing education for mediators and evaluators, and the conference provides up to 12.5 hours toward continuing education or initial training for child custody mediators, evaluators and juvenile dependency mediators.

### **To obtain a certificate of conference attendance to use to apply for continuing education with one's accrediting institution, follow these steps:**

1. Sign up for a certificate of conference attendance at the AFCC Registration Desk. There is a processing fee of \$15 for AFCC members and \$20 for non-members. *The certificate will verify attendance at conference sessions and may be used to apply for continuing education credits with the registrant's accrediting institution.*
2. Fill out and sign the "Verification of Session Attendance" form on the reverse side and return it to the AFCC Registration Desk. Your certificate will arrive in the mail in 3-4 weeks.
3. Psychologists, social workers, California MFTs, LCSWs, LEPs, LPCCs, and California attorneys must sign in and out at each session attended. Separate sign in sheets will be provided at eligible sessions.
