Proposal Instructions

AFCC is accepting proposals for 90-minute in-person workshop sessions. To submit a proposal using the online form, please visit the 61st Annual Conference page on the AFCC website. You must submit the following information:

- 1. The name and email address of the presenter who will coordinate your workshop.
- 2. A workshop title (no more than 80 characters).
- 3. An abstract of up to 250 words describing your proposed workshop.
- 4. A program-ready description of your proposed workshop (up to 90 words) for the conference brochure. Note: AFCC reserves the right to edit description for consistency.
- 5. A description of the relevance of your workshop to the AFCC community (up to 250 words).
- 6. A description of the limitations of the proposed content, including contradictory perspectives and/or evidence.
- 7. For research proposals, please include a brief description of your methodology, results, conclusions, and applications for practice and policy implications, and for future research (up to 350 words).
- 8. As part of AFCC's commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI), please describe how your workshop will incorporate issues of diversity and/or culture in relation to your topic (e.g., diversity of speakers, DEI lens applied, limitations to be addressed). This may include but is not limited to race, ethnicity, sex, gender identity, age, ability status, career status, sexual orientation, religion and beliefs, or nationality. Up to 250 words.
- 9. Three citations from professional literature within the last ten years that provide support for your program (**do not include** links to websites, newsletter articles, or statutes).
- 10. Two learning objectives that will be addressed by your proposed workshop.
- 11. Complete contact information for all proposed presenters.
- 12. Name and information for each presenter as it will appear in the program (name, up to two academic degrees, organization, city, state/province, country).
- 13. Two professional references with contact information.
- 14. CVs/resumes and a brief bio for all proposed presenters must be uploaded with your proposal or emailed to psommer@afccnet.org. Please save each attachment (Word document or PDF) under the name of the presenter.
- 15. When submitting proposals, presenters agree to submit materials by the deadlines provided by AFCC.

There is a maximum of four presenters per workshop (including a moderator). The deadline for proposals is 11:00pm Eastern Daylight Time (USA), **October 2, 2023**. Each presenter may be included on a maximum of two proposals. AFCC is unable to guarantee consideration of incomplete proposals or those submitted after the deadline. AFCC offers reduced registration rates for conference presenters, but does not reimburse for travel, lodging, and related expenses. All proposals must be submitted via the online form.
