Webinar Brown Bag lunch

Dodge County Family Court Counselling hosted an AFCC brown bag lunch webinar event on April 12, 2017 for the Matthew Sullivan presentation on Visitation Resistance. The event was advertised by the Dodge County Bar Association and personal invitations were sent via email to the Judges and local Family Court attorneys. There was no cost to attend and everyone was encouraged to bring their own lunch. Attendees were notified certificates of attendance would not be issued.

The event was held at the Dodge County Justice Facility located in Juneau, Wisconsin in the Jury Assembly room. There were two projectors; one with Dr. Sullivan and the other with his PowerPoint. The PowerPoint slides were subsequently sent out to those in attendance: Judges, Guardians ad Litem, Family Court Counselling staff, and Family Court Attorneys. After the video presentation there was approximately a one-hour live discussion on the issues.

Overall, it was a successful first event and positive feedback was received from all in attendance. One Judge remarked on the timeliness of the event based on a case he had pending. One suggestion was to schedule future events at the same time each month, preferably on a Friday. For example, hosting an event at noon on the 2nd Friday of every month. As the webinars are archived for members to access, this is possible, although the ability to submit questions to the presenter would be lost.
